



RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE CZECH REPUBLIC

dated March 19, 2020, No. 267

on adopting an emergency measure

Following the Governmental Resolution No. 194 dated March 12, 2020, by which the Government, in line with Art. 5 and 6 of the Constitutional Act No. 110/1998 Coll., on Security of the Czech Republic, declared a state of emergency for the territory of the Czech Republic due to threat of health in connection to proven outbreak of coronavirus /designated SARS CoV-2/ in the territory of the Czech Republic and in line with Section 5 letter a) to e) and Section 6 of the Act No. 24/2000 Coll., on Emergency Operation and on change of other Acts ("Emergency Act"), as amended, for the purpose of resolving the emergency situation, the Government hereby decided on adoption of emergency measures, under Section 5 letter c) and e) and Section 6 (1) letter b) of the Emergency Act, as follows:

The Government

- I. **instructs**, with the effect as of March 21, 00:00 (midnight), that any and all cross-border employees, besides the confirmation for cross-border employees, have to submit also the "book of cross-border employee" when crossing the state border for the purpose of Police of the Czech Republic making a stamp evidencing crossing of the state border to prove regularity and frequency of crossing the state border;
- II. **instructs** the foreigners holding an Employee Card or Blue Card to notify the change of employer on the day of commencement of the work at latest to the Ministry of Interior, in case of the employer implementing emergency measures or helping to implement emergency measures during the state of emergency. The conditions for performing the employment are considered fulfilled by delivery of such notification;
- III. **approves** the possibility of foreigners to change the employer within the territory of the Czech Republic without the obligation to fulfill the condition of 6 months prior employment within the Czech Republic (Section 42g (7) of the Act No. 326/1999 Coll., on Stay of the Foreigners).
