



RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE CZECH REPUBLIC

dated March 23, 2020, No. 281

on adopting an emergency measure

Following the Governmental Resolution No. 194 dated March 12, 2020, by which the Government, in line with Art. 5 and 6 of the Constitutional Act No. 110/1998 Coll., on Security of the Czech Republic, declared a state of emergency for the territory of the Czech Republic due to threat of health in connection to proven outbreak of coronavirus /designated SARS CoV-2/ in the territory of the Czech Republic and in line with Section 5 letter a) to e) and Section 6 of the Act No. 240/2000 Coll., on Emergency Operation and on change of other Acts ("Emergency Act"), as amended, for the purpose of resolving the emergency situation, the Government hereby decided on adoption of emergency measures, under Section 5 letter c) and Section 6 (1) letter b) of the Emergency Act, as follows:

The Government

- I. **determines** that the exception from the Governmental Resolution No. 198, dated March 12, 2020 and No. 203 dated March 12, 2020 for cross border employees on borders with Republic of Austria and the Federal Republic of Germany relates only to persons, who travel abroad only for the period longer than 21 calendar days;
- II. **obliges** with the effect as of March 26, 2020, 00:00
 1. to any and all persons specified in point I. of this Resolution that immediately after their return to the Czech Republic they notify this fact, by phone or other distant access to their registry provider of health services in the field of general practice or general practice for children and youths, or should they not have such registry provider, then to any provider in the field of general practice or general practice for children and youths,
 2. any and all providers of health services in the field of general practice of practice for children and youths, that they issue a decision on quarantine in the duration of 14 days under Section 2 (7) letter a) of the Act No. 258/2000 Coll., for the persons stipulated in the point I.
